

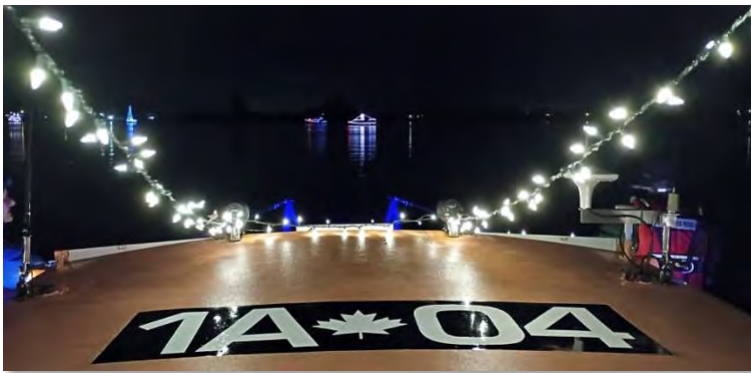


Ladner Carol Ships safety patrol

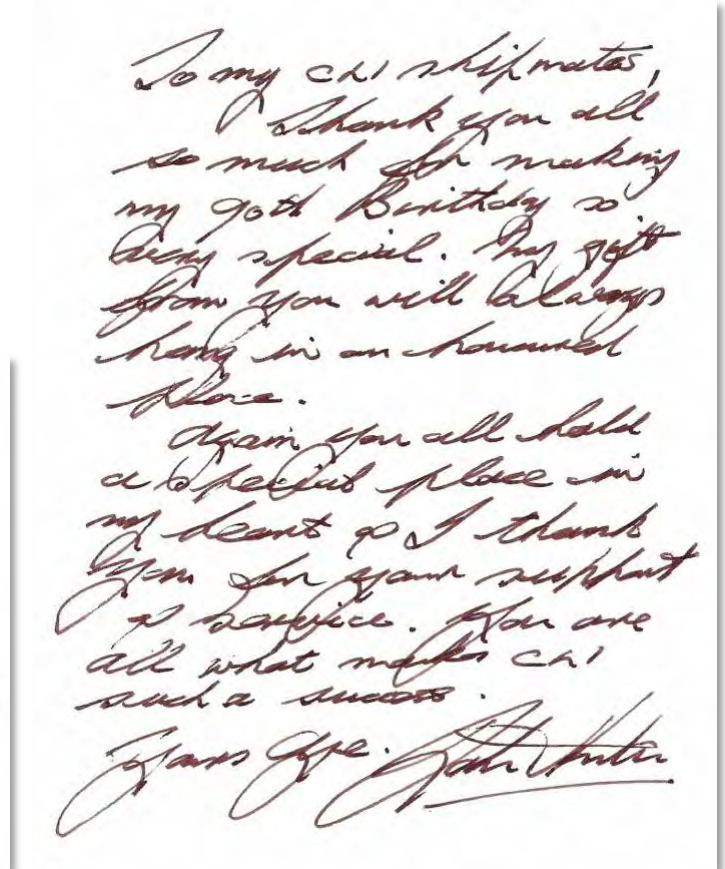

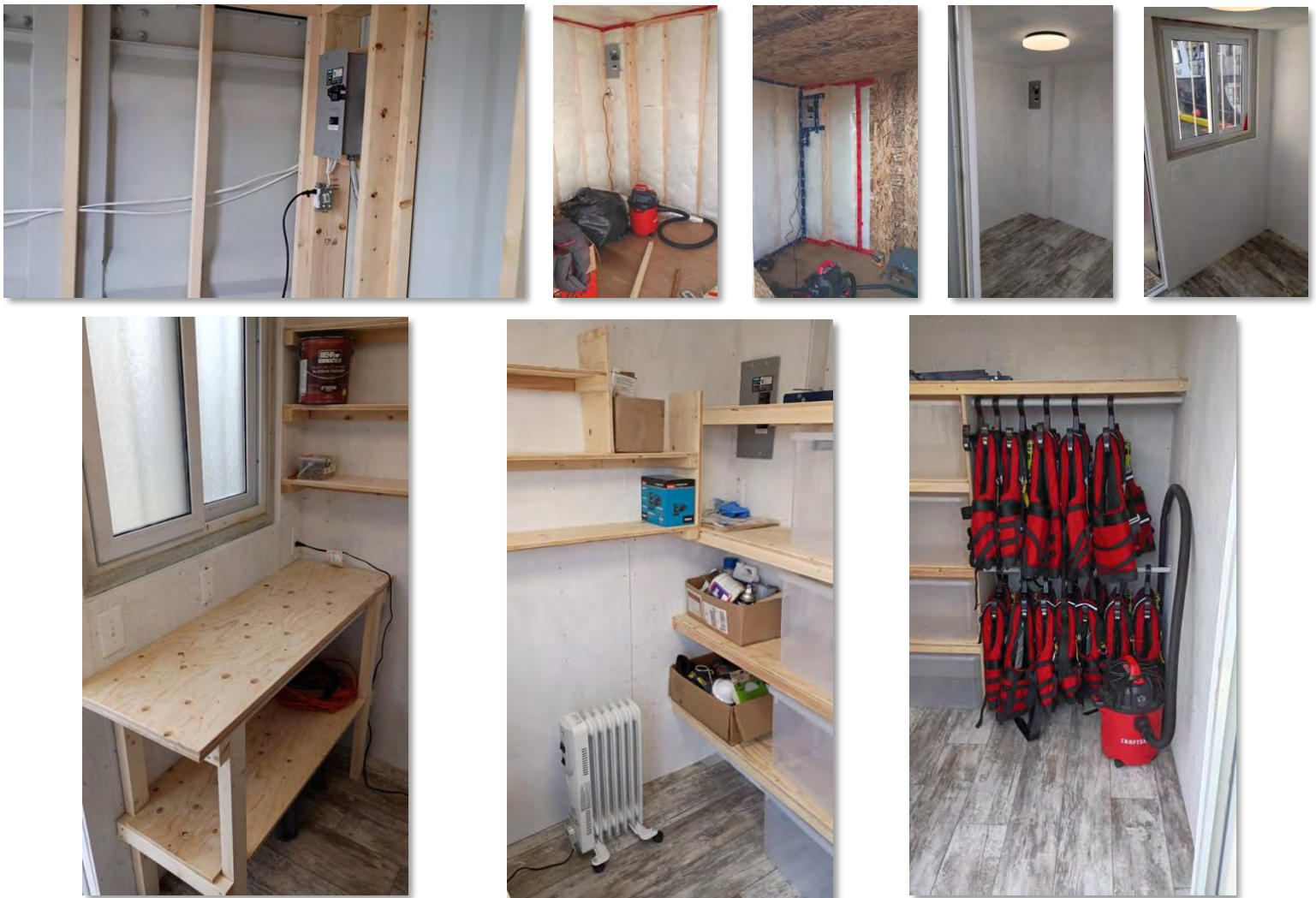
Congratulations on this next step in your CLI career and being the 3rd coxswain who is working himself up from the ranks.

Use public transport (Canada Line) to get to Vancouver Convention Centre West. Walk from the end of the line (Waterfront) to the venue. There will be a FREE Shuttle Bus Service. **Wednesday** Noon – 8:00pm **Thursday – Saturday** 10:00am – 8:00pm **Sunday** 10:00am – 5:00pm

Shuttle bus service will run continuously between the Vancouver Convention Centre West and Granville Island. Because the In-Water show closes earlier, there will be limited service between 5:00pm to 8:30pm. Wednesday-Saturday the last shuttle departing the Vancouver Convention Centre will be at 8:15pm. Wednesday-Saturday the last shuttle departing Granville Island for the Vancouver Convention Centre will be at 5:15pm. 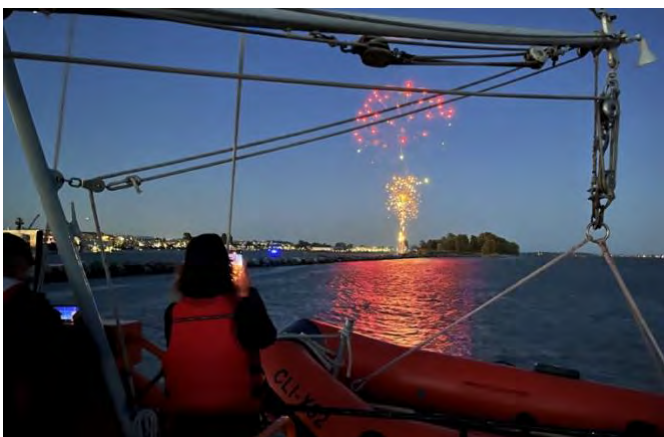
